John Lane also served for six months in Captain William Phillips' Company and noted that after the capture of Phillips the company was 'broken up'. British Lieutenant John Dochstedder, leading the attack on the Phillips company claimed that he watched a Bedford County Militia Lieutenant leave the cabin with twenty-some men an hour before the actual battle began on 16 July 1780.
