Before me the subscriber one of the Associate Judges of the Court of Common Pleas in and for the County aforesaid in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Personally appeared Detrich Ourhand late a soldier in the Revolutionary War with Great Britain and a Citizen of the County of Huntingdon aforesaid in which he doth reside, and after being duly sworn according to law by me He doth depose and say that he was duly enlisted by Jacob Snyder a first Lieutenant in a Company commanded by Captain George Whitget in the Regiment commanded by Colonel Walter Stewart in the Pennsylvania Line on or about the fourteenth day of January in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and seventy eight. That he was transferred to Captain Bankson's Company in the same Regiment after the Battle of Monmouth in Jersey and continued in the service of the United States until the fourteenth day of January in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and eighty one, having served three years being the time for which he was enlisted and was discharged by General Anthony Wayne a Brigadier General of the Pennsylvania Line on that day. That this deponent will on the eighth day of next November be fifty seven years of age; that he labours under Rheumatic pains of a severe kind, which renders him unable to do any business for three or four months in a year, which disorder he apprehends he became subject to when a soldier as aforesaid by being exposed to hard life and cold in the service in his youth. That he is reduced in his circumstances in life and stands in need of assistance from his Country for support for himself his wife and two youngest children, his other children being employed for their own support.
